In 2023, our RCOT co-opted BAOT UNISON Steward, Mike Griffiths, had an extremely busy year as the Unison representative on the Committee. He is an asset to our committee and has a wealth of knowledge. Mike participates in all work-related matters regarding pay, cost of living, strikes and campaigning.

Lifelong Learning Grant

Consider applying for a Lifelong Learning Grant (LLG). The LLG provides financial support for RCOT members to participate in learning opportunities, such as short courses, workshops or conferences. Preregistration Bsc and Msc courses are not eligible for LLG funding.

Occupational Formulation is the part of occupational therapy processes that synthesizes information from

your occupational therapy assessment and discussion with the person into a structured narrative underpinned by occupational theories and models.

Rob Brooks is co-creator of the Occupational Formulation process and associate professor of occupational therapy in the University of Bradford. This session will provide members with an introduction to the background of 'formulation in practice', will detail recommended ways of structuring occupational formulation and give opportunities for members to have a go.
